A Strategy: Education → Support group conversions



I have reflected on the recent challenges we have faced getting enrollment and turnout for Family to Family or Basics classes. First, I want to say the fact that we are offering the classes and raising awareness in the community of the work that we do is already a win. However, where we would have liked to have filled our educational offerings this year, I think we must use the opportunity to convert these classes to Support groups. Once Support groups are formed, and we have a sufficient base, we would then plan an educational class and use the support group as outreach to fill the classes. For me, this story underscores the importance of our work in CIT and Louisville.

Thank you to our officers who are involved in CIT and to the volunteers who are there to convey the complexities of mental illness to our officers.
